"The Culture of Polar Science"

An anthropological perspective of research in Antarctica, with a focus on studies at the American research stations McMurdo, Palmer and South Pole.

This presentation will also look at the culture of polar logistic workers who make scientific research possible, including the unique and recent history of women's roles in this society. Finally, some of the associations between Antarctica and Greenland will be mentioned.

My anthropological work in Antarctica has focused specifically on group cultural and social dynamics, women's roles and injury prevention. I have worked for climate scientists on the ice cap in Greenland and throughout Antarctica collecting and analyzing data, and managing field research stations, among other logistical responsibilities, for 18 seasons.

Currently, I am working as a research assistant for the Colorado Injury Control Research Center. These combined experiences have helped to shape my Master's thesis research in anthropology at Colorado State University.
